# Safety

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Safety messages are provided in this manual to describe possible risk during operation, maintenance and transportation. These messages are intended to convey known hazards but cannot be construed to describe all possible risks.

## Operational Safety

The owner is responsible for providing proper operator training in the appropriate language. Operator and bystanders must wear OSHA-approved eye, ear, and head protection, along with any PPE required by local regulations. Do not wear loose clothing; it may catch on moving parts. Never operate equipment under the influence of drugs or alcohol. Only use this machine and connected equipment when it is in good working condition and properly maintained. Ensure all guards and safety devices are installed and functional before operation. Never leave running equipment unattended. Keep children and bystanders at 100 feet away unless they are the operator. Do not operate in conditions that limit visibility (fog, dust, rain, wind). Stop operation if conditions worsen. Avoid sharp turns, which can damage driveline components. Be aware of liquid sloshing inside tanks; shifting weight can cause instability or rollover. Attach the power unit on a level surface, and avoid operating on slopes to prevent rollovers. Equipment may be wider than the tractor so take caution to avoid hitting objects. Stay clear of high-speed air outlets. Follow all safety decals. Perform maintenance only when the machine is off, non-energized, and on level ground with adequate space. Keep away from rotating components such as fan, belts, drums, connectors, and driveline parts to avoid entanglement. Secure long hair to prevent entanglement in moving parts.

## **DANGER**

Failure to heed any of these warnings may result in personal injury or death.

## DANGER

Risk of death or injury if moving parts are touched, or are brought into contact with any person. Keep away from all moving parts. Keep guards in place while operating.

### Maintenance Safety

Before operating any equipment, inspect all fasteners, connectors, and mount points to ensure nothing is loose. Before adjusting, lubricating, or cleaning the machine, disengage the PTO and shut off all equipment. Use approved jack stands when working under the machine. Wear proper personal protective equipment during maintenance. When working with the plumbing system, be aware that chemicals may be present and could leak onto the skin.

## CAUTION

Rotating parts, Hydraulic hoses, motors and valves generate heat when operating. Do not touch when hot. Allow to cool before maintaining.

Risk of crushing, pinching or cutting due to motion of machine while maintaining. Ensure all energy is dissipated from hydraulic lines before maintaining. Secure power unit and attachment against motion with wheel chocks, or appropriately sized stands as required.

Remove key from power unit and read manual before maintaining. Risk of accidental motion if key is engaged on power unit. Knives wear parts and damaged components can have sharp edges that cause cuts or lacerations. Wear protective gear and handle these parts with care.

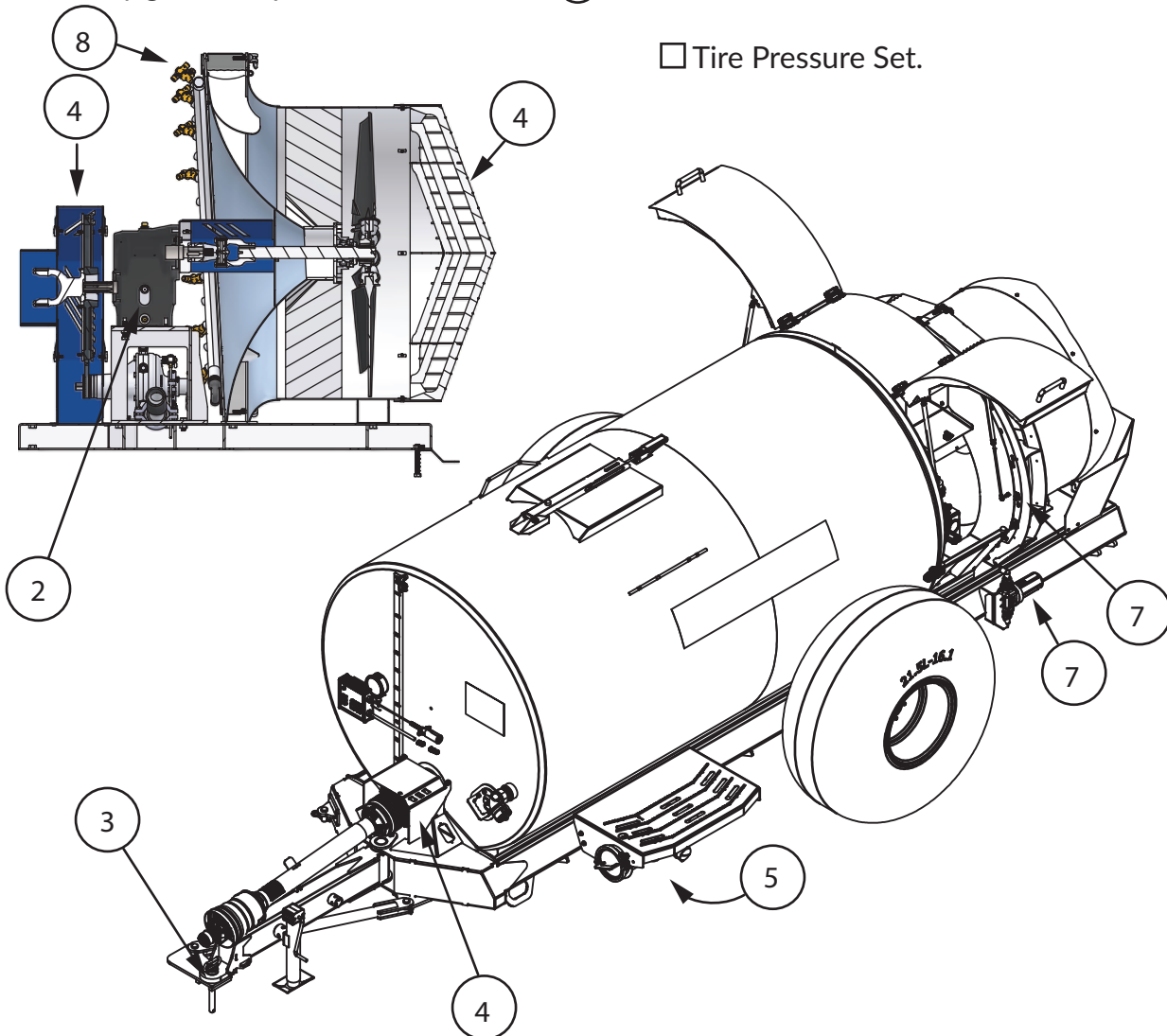
### Chemical Safety

Follow all EPA guidelines when mixing chemicals in the sprayer: Do not smoke, eat or wear contacts while handling chemicals. Wash hands before and after handling chemicals or contaminated surfaces. Wear required PPE such as goggles, respirator, gloves, spray suit, and boots. Know the signs and symptoms of chemical poisoning and review the MSDS for all chemicals being used. Mix chemicals only as instructed by the manufacturer and ensure proper dilution ratios when filling the tank. Understand the chemicals being used; mishandling can be dangerous. Clean tank in the field and dispose of rinse water according to regulations. Damage from improper cleaning is not covered by warranty. Record all chemicals used in the tank as required by local regulations. Rinse gloves, then wash hands thoroughly before eating, drinking, smoking, or using the restroom. Never touch or rub eyes when handling spray materials. Treat any clothing exposed to chemicals as contaminated. Keep the number for poison control readily available.

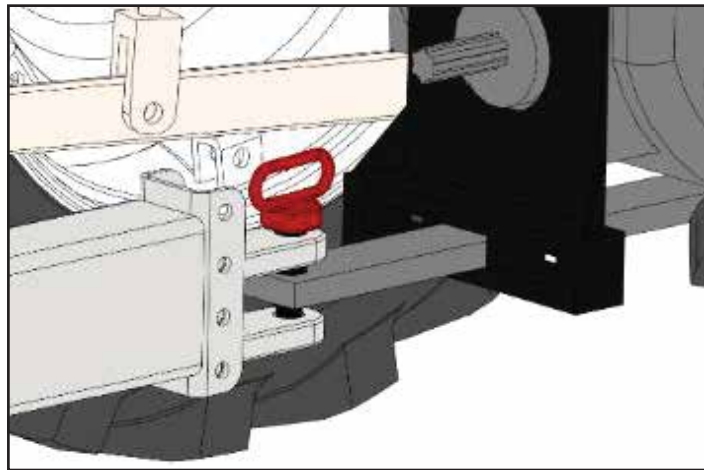
# Operation

## Attaching Hitch

### Straight Hitch:

Align the Flowcore hitch with the tractor drawbar. Pin the drawbar to Flowcore hitch. Add linch pin.

Once hitch is attached raise, stow, and positively pin the jack stand.

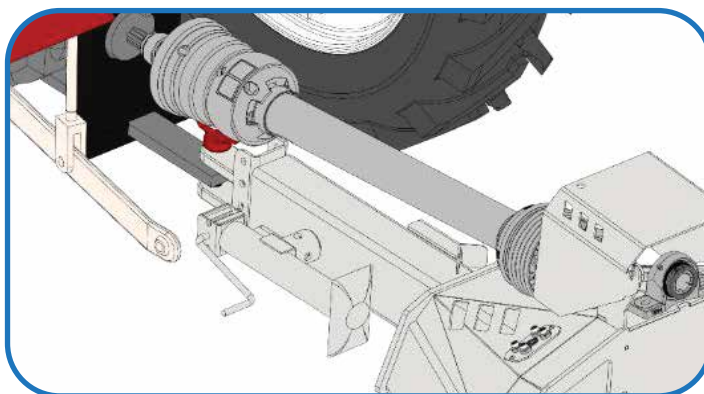
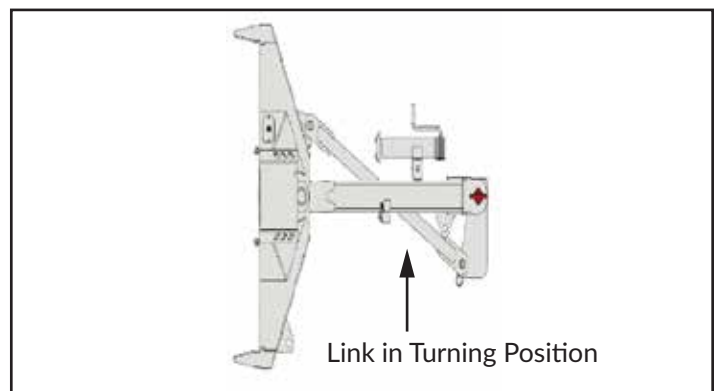
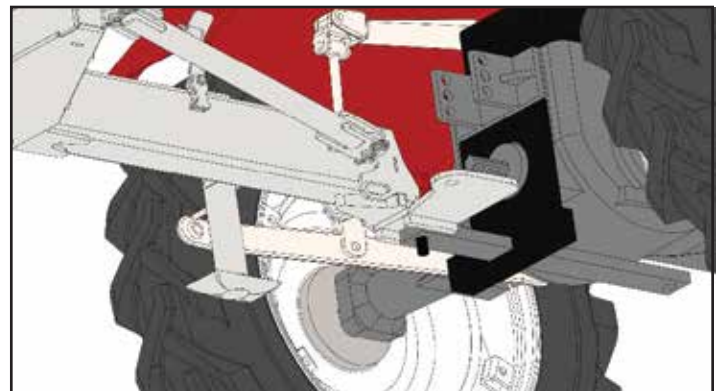
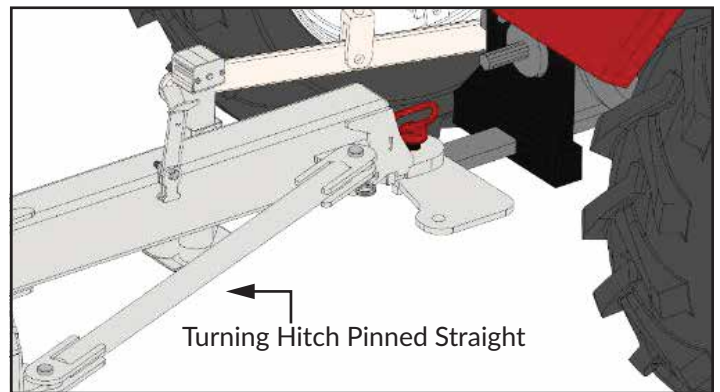


### Turning Hitch:

When attaching the hitch, convert tractor category 2 drawbar as shown in the turning hitch underside photo. Pin the drawbar to the Flowcore hitch. Add linch pin.

Once hitch is attached raise, stow, and pin the jack stand.

Once tractor is secured to the sprayer hitch, move the link assembly from the straight to turning position.



## Turning Hitch Settings:

Use **straight hitch** when towing.

Use turning hitch for regular spraying operations.

## DANGER

Do not transport sprayer at high speed, while in turn hitch setting.

## Attaching PTO to Tractor

Align and connect the female PTO Input with the tractor PTO shaft. Pull back on PTO connector to ensure ball is clicked in place.

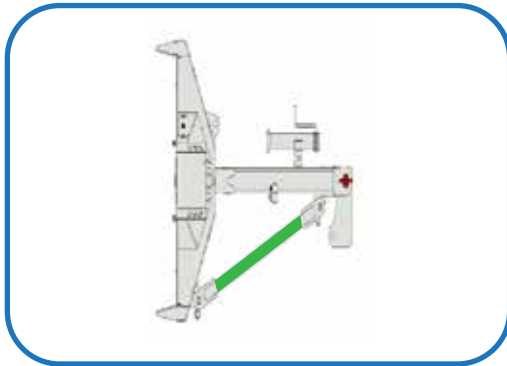
## Attaching PTO to Sprayer

When attaching the PTO shaft, confirm that it aligns with the bearing drivetrain shaft.

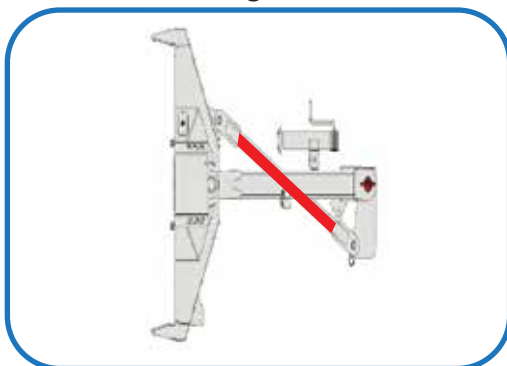
On completion:

- Verify that sprayer drive line bolt connection is tight.

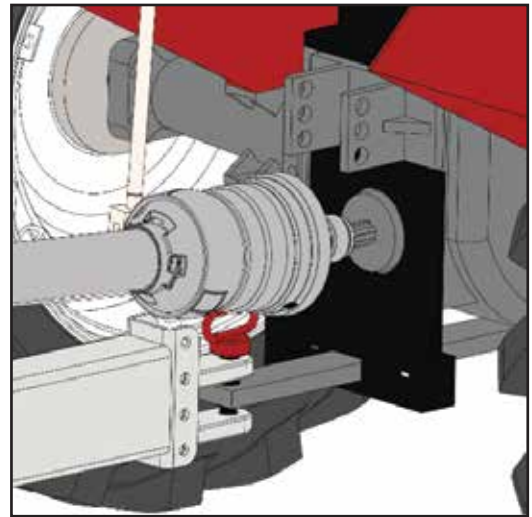
Straight Hitch



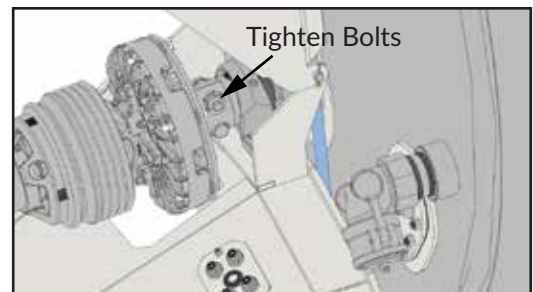
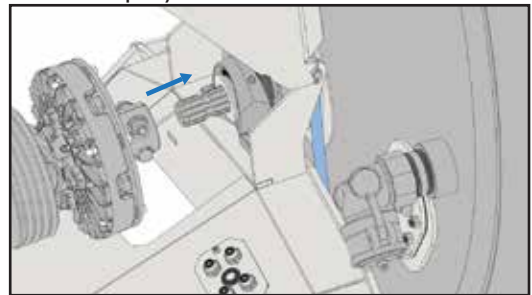
Turning Hitch



Tractor PTO Connection

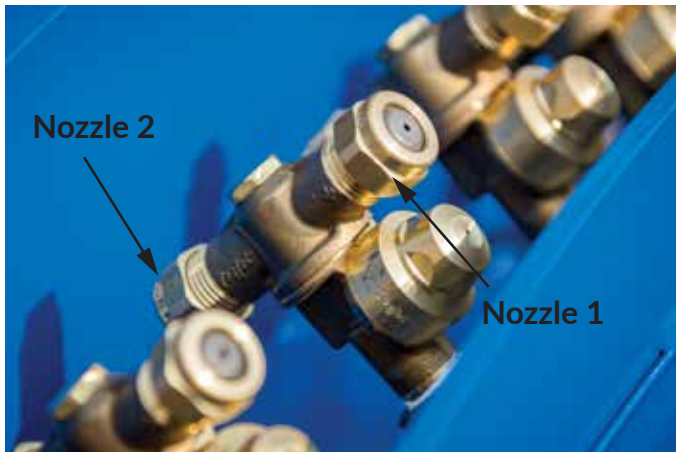


Sprayer PTO Connection



# Operation

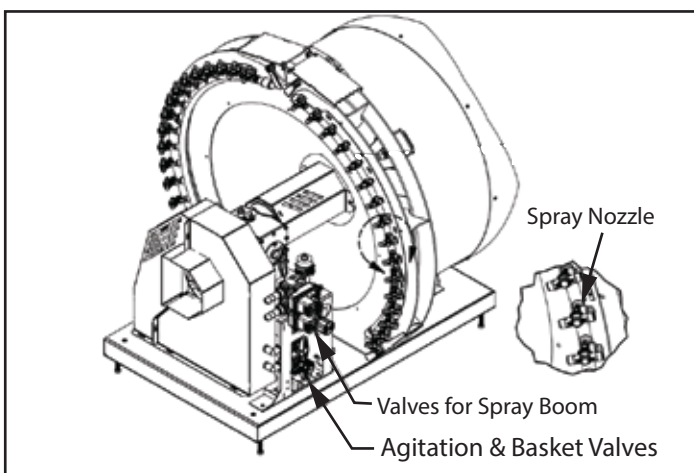
**Spray Nozzle** is composed of two outlet tips and allows three selections. Enable nozzle 1, enable nozzle 2, close nozzle. This design allows for the operator to have available configurations for easy switching.



**Boom Filters** are attached in line with each boom to remove small particles to limit clogging the spray tips. Each filter must be cleaned to prevent clogs.

**Boom Valves** (hydraulic or electrically driven) Turn Booms On/Off. The valves are controlled hydraulically or electrically.

**Spray Control (electric):** With an electric spray controls system, switches control the left and right nozzle booms.



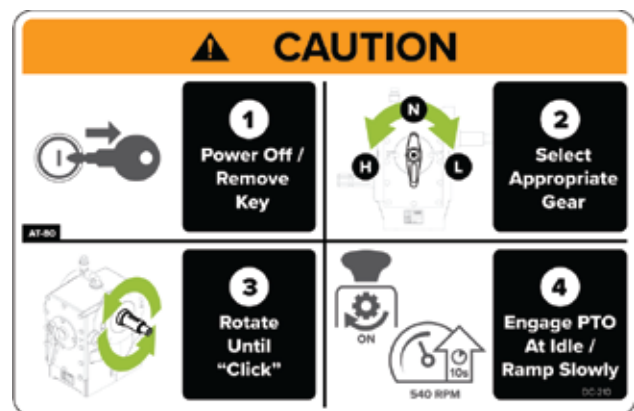
**Spray Control (hydraulic):** These controls are available on many tractors, operated using hydraulic remotes. Booms are actuated hydraulically, controlled within operator station hydraulic levers.

A Flowcore sprayer has two-speed **gearbox** that is manually selected before starting the machine. High speed provides more air output for taller trees. Low speed consumes less fuel.

## Gearbox Speed Selection

### Select High / Low Speed:

The two-speed gearbox can be changed by turning the handle from the center neutral position to either the high or low speed setting. Verify that gear is engaged fully before starting the machine. There is an audible click when fully engaged and in gear.

## **!** DANGER

Never attempt to change gear speed while running. Tractor should always be off.

## **!** WARNING

The high-speed setting will generate more air and will require more power from the tractor. Ensure sufficient power is available to run.

## Controls

### Electric:

Connect the Electric Control Box to the tractors 7- pin connection outlet.

Place and secure the electrical control box inside the cabin to prepare for spraying.

Control Box Overview:

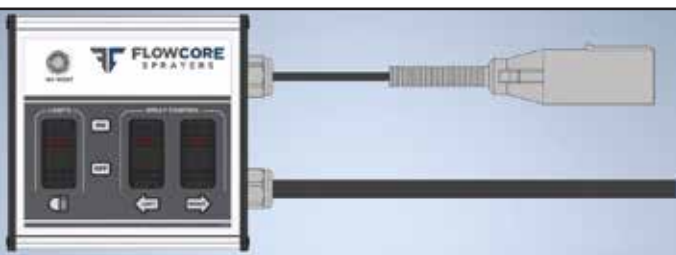
Left: Turns left boom On/Off

Electric Controls

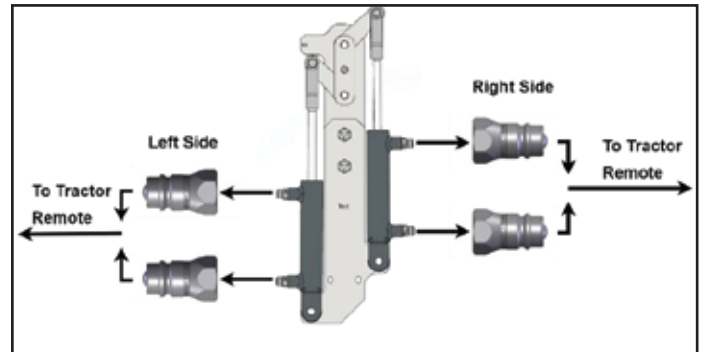


Control Box + 7 Pin Connector

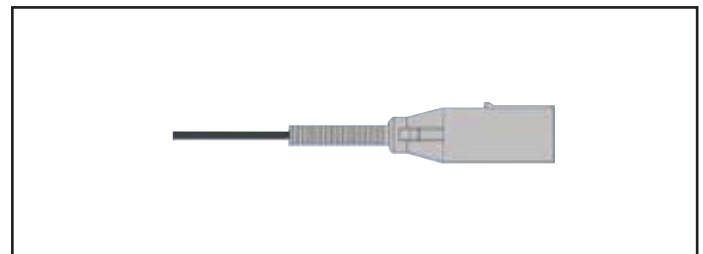
### Hydraulic:

Two pairs of hydraulic hose line are provided. Each pair of hoses are indicated by a L and R tag. Plug each pair to the tractor hydraulic remotes.

Connect the 7-pin trailer connector to the trailer connector to power lights.

## NOTICE

To enable sprayer controls, turn the Tractor head light switch to the on position. The light switch acts as the main power switch to the control box.

Lights on hydraulic machines actuate with trailer light selection.

# Operation

## Set Up

### Valve Setup:

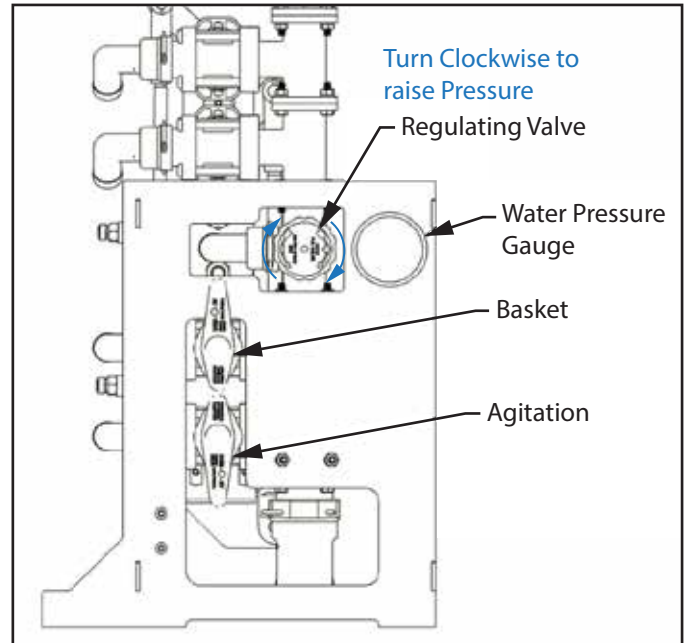
Fill the tank with water. Open the basket, agitation, and Main valve handle completely open. Prime the pump.

Verify that there is water flow through the basket and agitation line in the tank by running the PTO at a slow rpm.

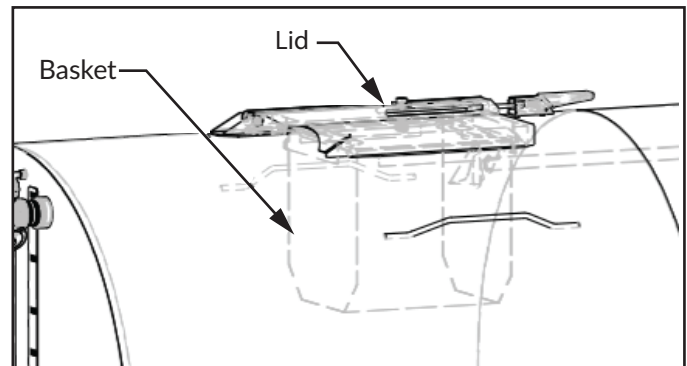
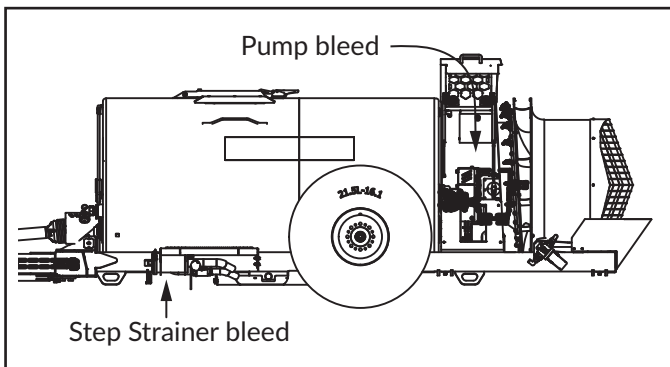
Check the pressure gauge and verify that pressure is not zero.

### Priming:

- Fill tank with water.
- Bleed air from step strainer.
- Bleed air from pump.
- Ensure PTO at idle, run pump to clear air from line.
- PTO to 540. Confirm around 100 PSI on gauge.

## Set Up (Continued)

Run the sprayer at 540 RPM. Verify desired pressure. If not, adjust the pressure using regulating valve. Turn clockwise to raise pressure.

If the sprayer runs dry due to lack of water, pump will need to be primed.

### **Load Material:**

With Sprayer/PTO off. Load material into basket. Run PTO at low idle, turn basket valve on to mix material into tank. Close lid.



## **CAUTION**


Do not load material with the sprayer running.


### **Agitate Material:**

Open Agitate Valve and run the PTO at low RPM to begin agitating the material that was loaded. Provide enough time to fully mix basket material with the tank. Once fully mixed, close basket valve and leave agitate valve open to avoid settling of material while spraying.

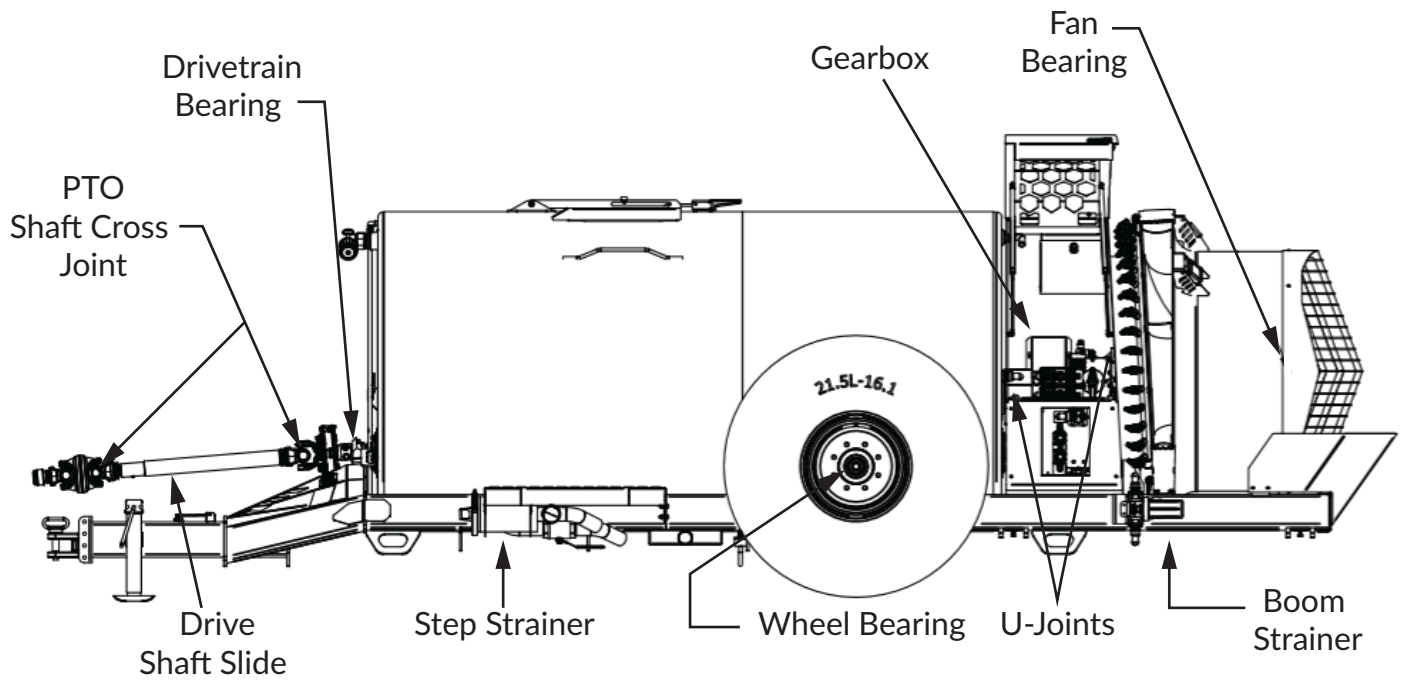

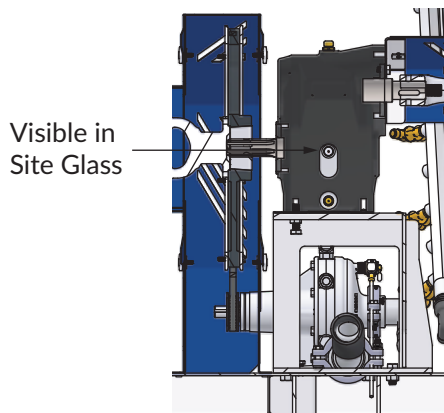

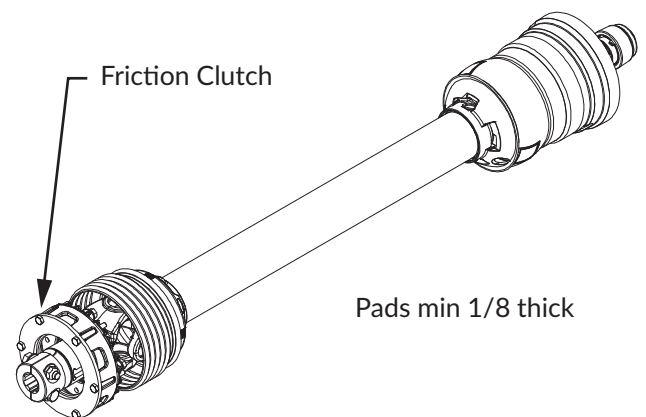
## Lubrication Locations



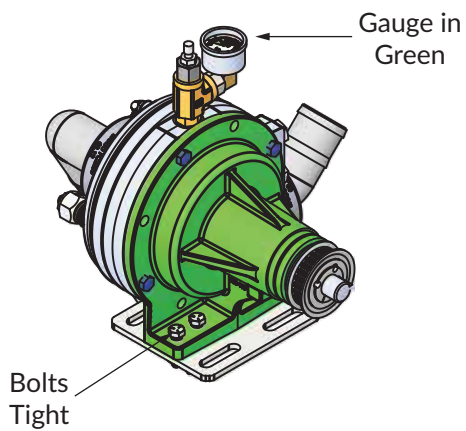

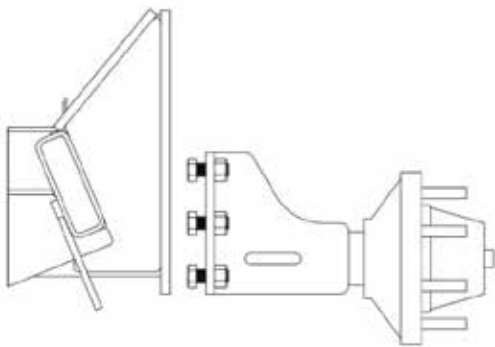
# Adjustments and Maintenance

## Axle Height Adjustment

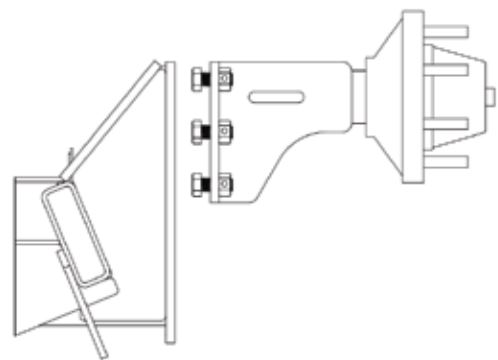
The Flowcore sprayer can be raised or lowered to allow different ride heights.

### **DANGER**

Before attempting to modify the spindle ride height, secure the sprayer frame with wood blocks to safely make any adjustments. By selecting one of the following options, lower the frame by the selected amount. If there is high brush or other obstructions, they may hit the frame. Ensure that the spindle mount bolts are properly torqued. Always secure spindle assembly with all available mounting holes.

# Adjustments and Maintenance

## Transportation

When transporting the Flowcore sprayer on the road:

- When loading onto a trailer, utilize the 4 tie-down locations to safely secure the sprayer in place using load-rated tie down straps or chains.
- When towing, add 100+ gallons of water to prevent sway.
- Use trailer hitch safety chains.



## WARNING

Only the Operator can determine the maximum safe operating speed of the sprayer during transport. Use proper tire pressure for the given road conditions.

# Adjustments and Maintenance

## Spray Calibration

### Step 1: Fundamental Calculations

Calculate the GPM per nozzle to determine the required nozzle.

Assumptions:

All nozzles are the same size.

$$\frac{2 \times \boxed{A} \times \boxed{S} \times \boxed{RS}}{990 \times \boxed{N}} = \boxed{M}$$

### Step 2: Identify Spray Parameters

$\boxed{A}$  = Target Sprayer Output (Gallons Per Acre)

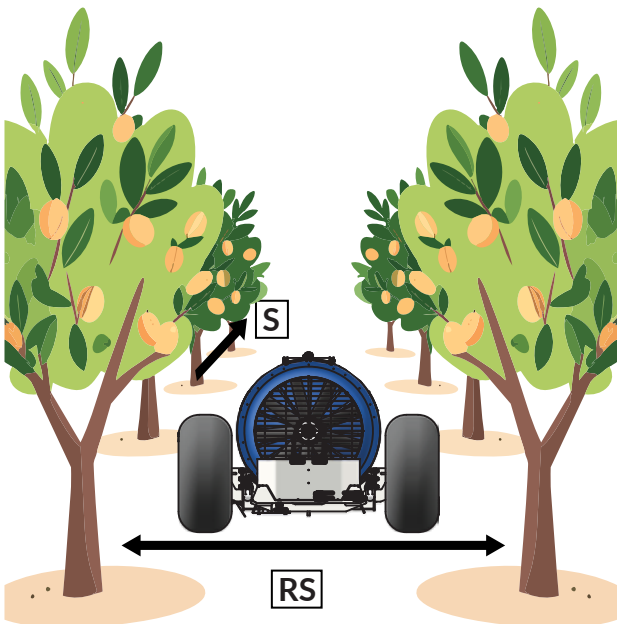
$\boxed{S}$  = Sprayer Speed (Miles Per Hour)

$\boxed{RS}$  = Crop Row Width (Feet)

$\boxed{N}$  = Number of active nozzles to be used.

$\boxed{M}$  = Feed Rate (Gallons per Minute)

### Step 3: Calculate nozzle size

#### Example Calculation:

Tractor Driving Speed:  $\boxed{S}$  = 4 Miles Per Hour

Crop Row Spacing:  $\boxed{RS}$  = 22 Feet

Coverage:  $\boxed{A}$  = 150 Gallons Per Acre

Active Nozzles:  $\boxed{N}$  = 36

### Step 4: Choose Nozzle

Several combinations of nozzle size and pressure can be used to achieve the same  $\boxed{M}$  GPM per nozzle. Nozzle selection is a trade-off between coverage, penetration of canopy and drift. High pressure on smaller nozzle size is for good coverage but is prone to drift. Lower Pressure on larger nozzle size has better canopy penetration and low drift, but may have more variable coverage. Consult a professional pest control advisor. The Flowcore can produce up to 150 psi. For most applications 60-100 psi is recommended.

# Adjustments and Maintenance

## Replacing the Belt

Step 1: Remove belt guard.

Step 2: Loosen water pump mount bolts.

Step 3: Loosen pulley flange. Push the driveline shaft forward to shorten and create a gap for the belt to pass through.

Step 4: Replace the belt.

Step 5: With the new belt seated on the pump and main pulley, tension belt.

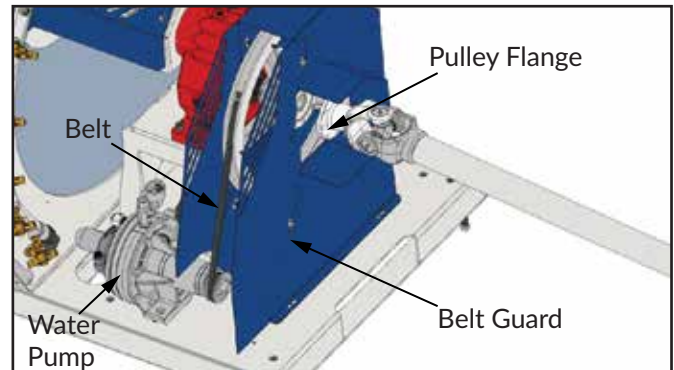
## Belt tensioning

To tension belt, pull the pump away from the main pulley. A properly tensioned belt will have a deflection of no more than 1/2in as shown in the diagram. If the belt is too loose, the belt will get damaged. Secure pump mount bolts.

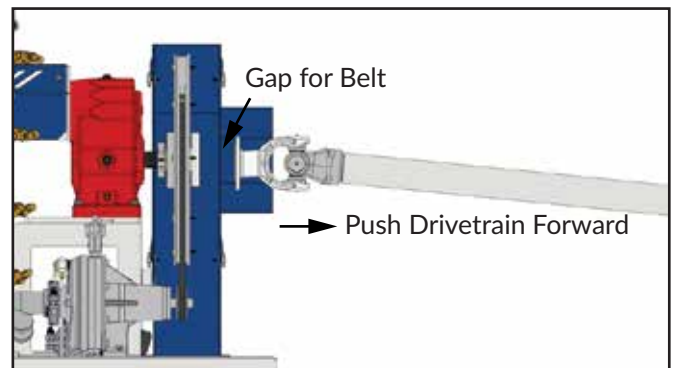
Step 6: Reconnect the u-joint flange to the face of the main pulley. Use a star pattern when installing the bolts. Use the following Torque each bolt.

Bolt Size: 3/8-16 Length 1.5in  
Torque Requirements: 37 FT-LBS

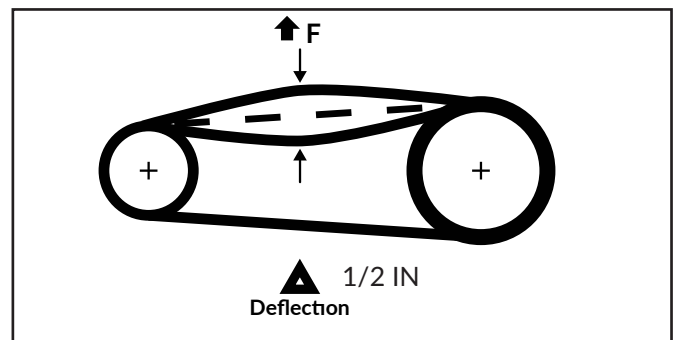
Step 7: Reinstall the belt guard.

Never attempt to service the machine while running. Use wheel chocks and parking brake.

# Frequently Asked Questions

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**Q. Where is the serial number located?**

**A.** The serial number is located the front hitch area.

**Q. Where are replacement parts sold?**

**A.** First contact local dealer. Make sure to have replacement part numbers that are needed and serial number ready when calling. If local dealer is unable to help, contact Valley Tool Parts.

**Q. What is causing water leaks when spraying?**

**A.** Stop machine and inspect all water connections for leaks. If tightening a connection does not stop the leak, the system may require servicing. Follow all local regulations for safe disposal. Do not operate the machine until all leaks are fully repaired. Running with leaks poses safety risks and may result in chemical exposure.

**Q. What should be done if there is a burning smell of rubber near the the sprayer when it running?**

**A.** Shutoff the spayer and disconnect the PTO shaft before inspecting belts. Adjustt belt tension as needed. Over-tightening or loose belt can cause heat buildup, slippage, and premature belt failure.

**Q. When should belts be replaced?**

**A.** Replace belts when experiencing repeated slipping or breaking of belts. Before replacing try adjsutng the level of tension. If that does remedy the problem, replace the belt. Have an extra belt on hand to minimize downtime.

**Q. What to if belts are wearing out too fast and burning up?**

**A.** First, check belt tension. Belts should have 1/2" sway in them. Check pulleys for debris, damage, or wear.

**Q. Does the gearbox need to be filled with oil before the sprayer is used?**

**A.** No, gearbox is factory filled and tested. Verify proper oil level everytime before running the sprayer. Check for shaft seal leaks.

**Q. How much gear oil should be added when repalcing?**

**A.** Fill from the lower middle fitting. Stop when oil begins to come out. Don't overfill.

**Q. Is it possible to run the pump without water in the tank?**

**A.** Yes, temporarily. It is best not to run the pump on an empty tank.

**Q. What to do if pump pressure goes low?**

**A.** When water level lowers, increase the regulator pressure. Decrease pressure when the tank is full. Check that the basket and agitate valved are closed.

**Q. Why are only a few nozzles spraying?**

**A.** Clogging due to debris can contribute to clogs. Flsuh clogged nozzles. Ensure all three filter sections are kept clean. Check all filters for any clumps that have formed. Clear any obstructions in the filter. Replace with spare parts as necessary.

**Q. What to do if gauge is bouncing up and down?**

**A.** Tank is low or capturing air. Refill or operate at lower speed.
